



What is the **Computing Scholar Program?**

Computing's summer program is an important part of our recruiting and workforce pipeline. Comp provides administrative support, facilities, and programs that facilitate student-mentor interaction, and seminars that enrich the educational experience of the students. Typically in residence for 12 weeks (with the opportunity to extend the experience), each student works closely with staff on a project that addresses LLNL's missions. For students, this exposure can allow them to envision career opportunities that they never knew existed.

- ~175 students per year (year-round internships offered)
- 3 micro-programs help address critical skills needs (Data Science Summer Institute, Cybersecurity Summer Institute, High Energy Density Physics)
- ~100 mentors
- Livermore Lab Foundation partnership for local high school student internships
- Regional Center of the East Bay partnership for neurodivergent students
- Computing Seminar Series (summer only)
- Social events (e.g., Apple Time; summer only)

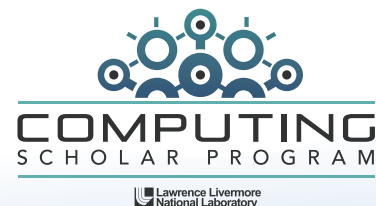

STANDARD SUMMER:

Posting open: August–January
Internship: April–August



STANDARD FALL:

Posting open: April–July
Internship: September–December



STANDARD SPRING:

Posting open: August–November
Internship: January–March
